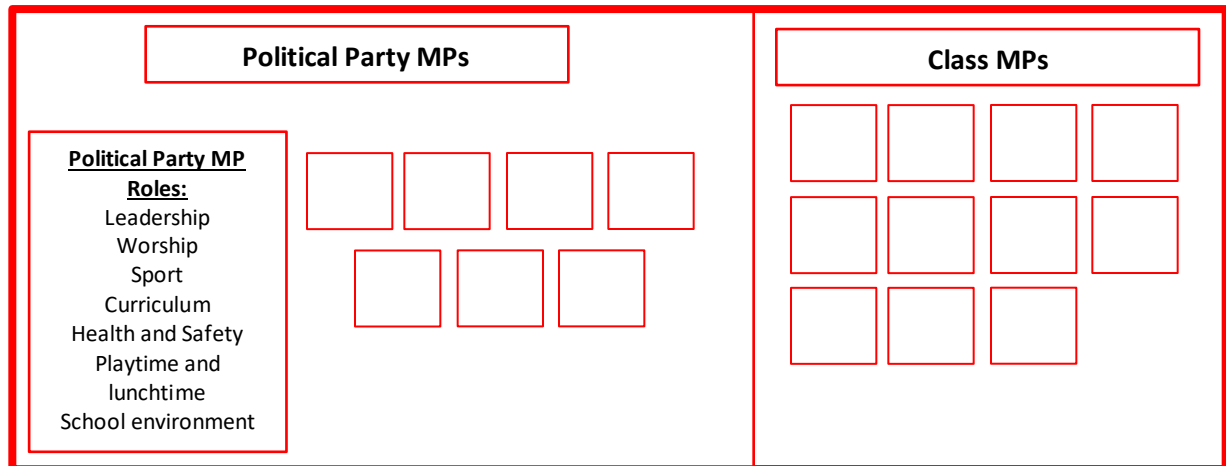




Stanley St. Peter's School Parliament

48 Year 6 children ÷ 8 political parties = 6 children in each political party

6 members of the political party + 11 class MP members = members of the school parliament



The Political Party MPs will contain members of the political party that are elected; these children will each have an area that they will be in charge of: Leadership, Worship, Sport, Curriculum, Health and Safety, Playtime and Lunchtime and the School Environment. This means when ideas or issues arise there will be one MP member that will take charge on it depending on the area it falls.

Leadership: liaising with the Head Teacher or SLT, speaking with the children's leadership team ('Digital Leaders'), keeping track of the main priorities.

Worship: events or special collective worships, speaking with the 'Worship Leaders', services at the church, community events in the local area.

Sport: PE coverage, tournaments, competitions, clubs, 'Get Active Leaders', 'Happiness Heroes', keeping active and fit.

Curriculum: lessons and learning, meeting with the Head Teacher, ideas for trips or themes, timetable of the school day.

Health and Safety: Damaged property, cleanliness of the school, meeting with the Caretaker or Business Manager, litter, behaviour in school, healthy eating.

Playtime and Lunchtime: meeting with Lunch Time Supervisors, sports coaches, buddies, games and activities, equipment, dining hall.

School Environment: areas around school, displays, classrooms, aesthetics of the school.

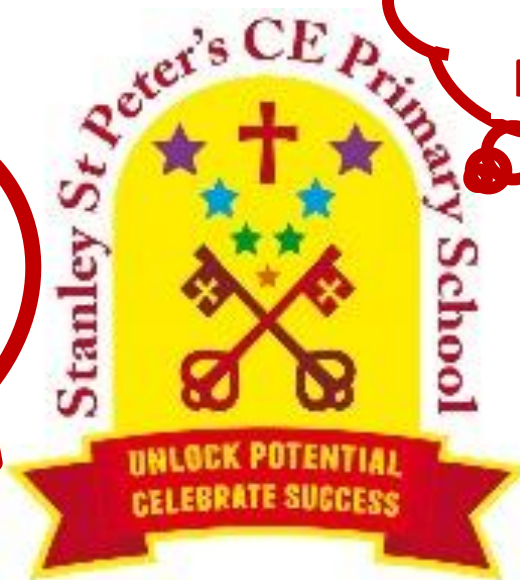
Even though each political party member has an assigned area, each MP may need to work together on certain tasks. This is because concepts and concerns brought to the meeting may overlap into different areas.

The class members, who vote for the child that they think will best represent their class in School Parliament meetings, elect the Class MPs. These members will then attend the meeting with their ideas and issues that their class would like to discuss. Therefore, every class has the opportunity to have their say at the meetings.

The school Parliament meetings will take place fortnightly to begin with then once a month thereafter. It will be led and organised by Miss Hogan (Class Teacher) to make sure the meetings are productive which will lead to a positive impact on the school.

It is important that the children feel that they have a voice that will be heard in school. By having this structure of School Parliament in place, children will be empowered to speak up about their considerations and concerns.
