## PARENT SURVEY...

A massive thank you to those grown-ups that completed our survey. 65 grown-ups in total completed the survey. We are really pleased with the results and would like to share some highlights with you below:

100% of parents said that their child was happy at school.

100% of parents said that their child felt safe at school.

100% of parents said that the school ensures that children behave well at school.

Out of the 13 parents that completed the survey who have a child with SEND, 12 parents felt that their child was receiving the support that they needed. ## Development Points...

3 grown ups felt that the school does not inform them of what their child will learn during the year. Please note that we hold BOY (beginning of year) meetings every year to share this information. If you are not able to come to these meetings, we post the presentations from these on our website. We also issue (via our website on class pages) a Parent Curriculum Overview every term and our Curriculum page on our website details the school's long term plans as well as individual subject long term plans are included in the subject pages. You are also able to speak to the class teacher and ask what your child is learning, I know the staff will be eager to share this with you.

2 grown ups disagreed that the school dealt with an instance of bullying effectively. As the survey is anonymous, I do not know who these parents are so please, if you feel this way (whether you completed the survey or not) I would be really interested in speaking with you to find out about your experience and look at what you feel we could have done better. We take our safeguarding duties immensely seriously and always investigate the rare complaints we get of bullying thoroughly. I want to ensure that ALL instances of bullying are dealt with effectively, every time, so I would welcome a conversation about this.
