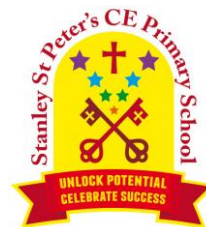


Tuesday, 4th January, 2022

Please ensure that your child does not arrive too early or too late and that they are picked up on time. We are requesting that all parents wear a face covering whilst on site and that as soon as the teacher arrives to supervise the line, that parents leave the premises.

Please try to socially distance from others whilst on our site – community transmission is high in Stanley so we really need to work together to try and keep children in school and protect our community.

We are not advising that children wear masks in school (young children tend to touch the masks often which

defeats the point of wearing them in the first place) but we will not stop any child from wearing a mask that wishes to wear one. If you wish for your child to wear a mask in school we do expect that you provide them with a fresh one each day and that you teach them how to safely remove them.

I would like to take this opportunity to tell you the current advice that we are offering with regards to COVID and attendance at school:

If anyone in your household tests positive for COVID we are requesting that you keep your child off school for 5 days if possible (any length of time is better than none). They should take daily lateral flow tests as per Government advice. If they develop symptoms, they should get a PCR test straight away and continue to stay at home. If they have no symptoms after 5 days and daily lateral flow tests are negative, they can return to school on day 6.

If your child has close contact with a positive case in school, we will write to inform you. Your child can continue to attend school but should take daily lateral flow tests for 7 days after the date of our letter.

If your child tests positive for COVID they are required to self-isolate by law. They should isolate for 10 days; however, they can stop self-isolating and return to school if they do a rapid lateral flow test on days 6 and 7 of their self-isolation period and:

- both tests are negative
- they did both tests at least 24 hours apart
- they do not have a high temperature

If you require any lateral flow test kits, please contact the office on 01924 663641.

Please also help us by being watchful for **any** symptoms of illness in your child. Children do not always have the 'typical' symptoms (cough, fever, loss of taste/smell), **so if your child is generally unwell and in particular has symptoms such as sore throat, headache, runny nose and sneezing, please keep them at home and get a PCR test if possible.**

During the time that your child is isolating for any reason, if they are not unwell, they should complete home learning tasks set on the home learning pages of our website and email their work (this may be screenshots or photos of the Oak Academy quiz results taken or written work) to their class teachers. Class teacher email addresses are detailed on the relevant home learning pages. EYFS children's work can be uploaded to Tapestry instead.
